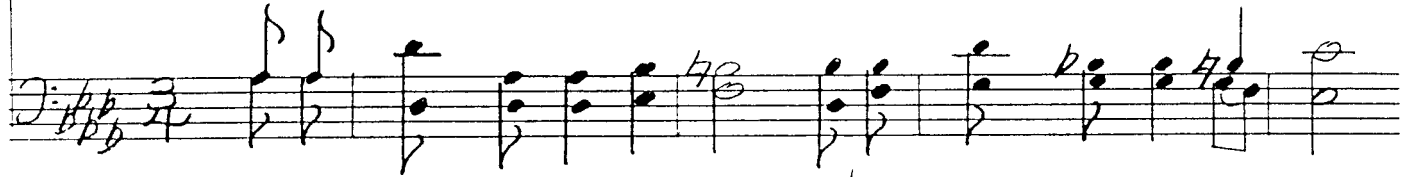


MAY THE PLAN OF GOD

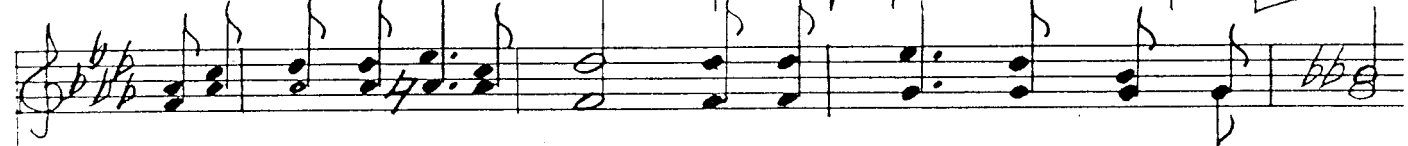
